WHERE DO WE COME FROM?

Cross Cultures' programmes are based on the basic assumption that you can win a war but you cannot win peace. Peace must be built in the self, between people, institutions, and societal structures and systems.

Furthermore, Cross Cultures' programmes are guided by our conflict philosophy and experiences, which centers around the belief that localised violence is what drives conflict by stirring hate and fear rather than the general themes of politics, religion, or ethnicity and that preventing/resolving conflict requires that people can communicate and develop positive relations with each other. Consequently, efficient localizsed peacebuilding efforts must be organised to foster communication and cooperation between adversarial groups so that they experience having something in common. This, in turn, increases trust and understanding of the "other" and helps people find a way to live together in peace.

Specifically, Cross Cultures uses our community-based Fun Sports activities as a vehicle to bring children, youth and adults living in conflict-sensitive areas together to communicate, interact, play, and collaborate across ethnic, social, and religious divides. Cross Cultures' Fun Sports approach thereby creates a "safe space" within the conflict that breaks down barriers between people by giving them an opportunity to form new perspectives and develop positive relationships that can grow outside the football field. Additionally, Cross Cultures' programmes include our Youth leadership Education that trains young volunteers to become Community Organisers and involves localizsed add-ons that match the specific context.

CROSS CULTURES' CORE PROGRAMME IS THE OPEN FUN FOOTBALL SCHOOLS. IT WAS FIRST INTRODUCED IN WAR-TORN BOSNIA-HERZEGOVINA IN 1998. THE INITIATIVE HAS PROVEN TO BE SO EFFECTIVE IN BRINGING PEOPLE TOGETHER THAT IT HAS BEEN IMPLEMENTED IN 23 COUNTRIES (OF WHICH 17 ARE ACTIVE TODAY) AND REACHED MORE THAN 1.8 MILLION DIRECT BENEFICIARIES, HERE AMONG 104.000 VOLUNTEERS.



ADDED VALUE

WHAT CAN WE OFFER OUR STAKEHOLDERS TO ACCOMPLISH THEIR GOALS?

THE PARTNERS OF CROSS CULTURES ALLIANCE USE FUN SPORTS TO PROMOTE PEACEFUL COEXISTENCE BETWEEN PEOPLE LIVING IN FRAGILE COMMUNITIES. HOWEVER, WHILE OUR INITIATIVES ALWAYS TAKE POINT OF DEPARTURE IN PEACEBUILDING, OUR PROGRAMMES OFFER A VARIETY OF LOCALISED ADD-ONS THAT FIT THE SPECIFIC CONTEXT AND NEEDS OF THE TARGET GROUP. CROSS CULTURES THEREBY APPLIES A NEXUS APPROACH AND CREATES SYNERGIES AND COMPLEMENTARITY BETWEEN PEACE, HUMANITARIAN, AND DEVELOPMENT EFFORTS.

Cross Cultures is specialised in using grassroots sport and especially the Open fun Football School programme and our Youth Leadership Education to promote:

- Peaceful coexistence and social integration creating positive relations, interaction, and dialogue between people from diverse backgrounds through fun sport and other social activities of common interest
- 2. Youth empowerment mobilising and enrolling young people in Cross Cultures Youth Leadership Education to provide them with transferable skills, hands-on experiences and wide-spanning social networks that empower them to become active participants in their communities, role models and actors for change, and thereby also enhances their employability and live oppertunities
- 3. Gender equality providing women and girls with equal opportunities to participate in sports and other social areanas based on their individual dreams and abilities rather than gender
- 4. Child protection using our fun sport activities to enable cross sector cooperation between e.g. sport clubs, schools, municipalities, parents, local police, National Sport Associations, and other CSO's that work together and exchange notions and experiences and agree on coordinated actions within the field of child protection
- 5. Grassroots democracy facilitating the formation of democratic grassroots sport clubs and other social networks all characterised by voluntarism, inclusivity, community participation and bottom-up organising



















YOUTH EMPOWERMENT

CROSS CULTURES' YOUTH LEADERSHIP EDUCATION

Cross Cultures has developed a specific educational leadership education for young people aged 18-30 years which is organized as an action-learning process encompassing three levels. It is a basic requirement that all volunteer leaders and coaches in Cross Cultures activities as minimum have completed the Basic level of 60 hours duration.

The Youth Leadership Education empowers young people, and just like Open Fun Football Schools, the key value of the Youth Leadership Education lies in its ability to facilitate the formation of a mutually reciprocal social network - i.e. a network that empowers the individual to create opportunities and better life conditions for themselves and wherein each individual helps strengthen the network to ultimately impact society.

BASIC LEVEL: 60 HOURS

The young community organisers are trained in theory and practice in how to use our specific fun sport approach as a pedagogical tool to mobilise local resources and create positive relationships between people of different ethnic and social backgrounds.

ADVANCED LEVEL: 120 HOURS

The community organisers are trained in how to bring the social qualities that arise between people when they play "a joyful game" together (friendships, cohesion, and social capital) into play outside the sporting arena.

FINAL LEVEL: 120 HOURS + PROJECT

The community organisers design, plan, organise, execute, and evaluate their own project to meet a special need in their community.

IMPACT

IN TUNISIA, JORDAN AND MOROCCO, CROSS CULTURES USES THE OPEN FUN FOOTBALL SCHOOLS PROGRAMME TO MOBILISE LOCAL RESOURCES AND EMPOWER UNEMPLOYED YOUTH COACHES.

IN TUNISIA 72% OF THE VOLUNTEERS AND IN JORDAN 61% HAVE GOT A JOB. (N=449) 74% OF THEM INDICATED THAT THE SKILLS AND NETWORKS THEY ACQUIRED THROUGH THE CROSS CULTURES-PROGRAMME HAD A DIRECT IMPACT ON THEIR SUCCESSFUL JOB SITUATION.



OPEN FUN FOOTBALL SCHOOLS





Open Fun Football Schools, is a big fun-footballcamp of five-days duration (minimum 24 hours) that are organised with the purpose to bring people to interact together across boundaries and societal divides;

AN OPEN FUN FOOTBALL SCHOOL ACCOMMODATES

- 200 GIRLS AND BOYS AGED 6-12 YEARS
- 2 OFFS-LEADERS (VOLUNTEERS)
- 12 OFFS-COACHES (VOLUNTEERS)
- 12 OFFS-COACH ASSISTANTS (VOLUNTEERS)
- 3 CLUB OFFICIALS/PARENTS (VOLUNTEERS)

The children are divided into 12 groups of approx. 16 players, one coach and one coach assistant and they are all accommodated at the same time on the same football pitch.

The Open Fun Football Schools are all tailored by the voluntary leaders and coaches to address their particular local context. Therefore, the Open Fun Football Schools differs from place to place.

FUN SPORT FESTIVALS / CARAVANS

Fun Sport festivals / Caravans, is a one-day festival organised in accordance with the same fundamental principles as the Open Fun Football Schools. The Fun Sport festivals / Caravans are often organised on specific occasions to celebrate specific days of attention such as for example: UEFAs week of grassroots football; the European week of Sports, International Women Day, World Diabetes Day, The World Heart Day, The UN Peace Day or specific sponsor events financed by UEFA CL-partners or others.

ASSOCIATION BUILDING, AND DAY-TO-DAY FUN SPORT ACTIVITIES

An outcome of Cross Cultures programmes is that volunteer leaders and coaches form their own grassroots democratic associations/clubs that amongst other organise after-school and day-to-day Fun Football activities which amongst other is paying attention on localised life-skill education and children with vulnerable backgrounds.





OPEN FUN FOOTBALL SCHOOLS - FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLES:

- 1. The Open Fun Football Schools must promote football for all. Consequently minimum 50% of all participants must be children aged 6-12 who are not yet members of a football club, but who would love to play football with their peers.
- 2. The Open Fun Football Schools must promote girl's football and our goal is a 50:50 gender balance on all levels: OFFS-players, OFFS-coaches and OFFS-leaders.
- 3. The Open Fun Football Schools must bring children and their OFFS-leaders and OFFS-coaches together across societal divisions. Consequently, to secure inter-ethnic integration the Open Fun Football Schools must be organised in compliance with Cross Cultures so-called "twin-city-approach" to secure that children and youth are playing fun football together in mixed groups and always together WITH each other and never against each other.
- 4. The Open Fun Football Schools must show social responsibility. Consequently, minimum 30% of all participants must be children and youth from socially disadvantaged groups, e.g. children with special needs, orphans, refugees/idp's, social cases etc.
- 5. The Open Fun Football Schools must be organised by voluntary OFFS-leaders and OFFS-coaches, who as a minimum has completed the Cross Cultures OFFS-leaders- and OFFS-coach education of minimum 60 hours duration.
- 6. The Open Fun Football Schools must be organised in close cooperation with the National Football Association and shall be democratic and transparent in its local anchoring (e.g. the Open Fun Football Schools programme in Moldova, Ukraine, Georgia, Armenia, Azerbaijan and South Sudan are all operated by the grassroots departments of the national FA).

CHILDREN:

Increased physical and mental wellbeing, peaceful coexistence, friendships, smiles, and social cohesion

VOLUNTARY COACHES:

Project-based collaboration and how to work with other like-minded individuals or groups to lead the broader community toward positive change, friendship, smiles and enhanced civic and social engagement.

COMMUNITY ORGANISERS

Enhanced skills in project and sport event management, community mobilisation, how to work with other like-minded individuals or groups to lead the broader community toward positive change, friendship, smiles, enhanced civic and social engagement, and design and implement their own initiatives to meet a special need in their community.



GENDER EQUALITY


Cross Cultures give special priority to female participation in all our activities. Our goal is to achieve an equal gender balance throughout all levels of our organisation. We wish to provide women with access to a domain that is still, by many, seen as a male domain.

When we make girls and boys play football together, establish female football teams, and recruit and train female coaches and volunteers, we do not only enhance the well-being and active community engagement of the participants, we also provide girls and women with alternative roles and opportunities. In this way, girls and women's participation in football becomes a valuable tool in combating gender-based stereotypes while at the same time stimulating women's well-being and active civic participation.

IT IS A BASIC PRINCIPLE THAT THE OPEN FUN FOOTBALL SCHOOLS MUST BE ORGANISED TO SECURE DIVERSITY IN TERMS OF THE SOCIAL BACKGROUND OF THE CHILDREN AND THE VOLUNTEERS

LOCAL PARTNERS INVOLVED IN OPEN FUN FOOTBALL SCHOOLS 1998-2018

To secure social and ethnic integration at Fun Sport Activities, all our activities are organised in compliance with our so-called twin-city approach. Thus, prior to the organization of an Fun Sport Activities we always contact the relevant Football clubs and community stakeholders and negotiate and sign a cooperation agreement with them, which is specifying the specific objective of the Fun Sport Activities, the demography of the participants (gender, ethnic, social backgrounds etc) and how the different actors should all bring their expertise and commitment to the actual implementation.

Thereby, we secure that the Fun Sport Activities do much more than build relations among children,

OFFS-coaches and their sport clubs. They also build a local structure for cooperation and community engagement. In this way, the programme gathers a number of stakeholders and actors around a mutual interest and always seeks to actively involve parents, municipalities, school teachers, community police, local sponsors, national and regional football associations, local and national media, ministries of youth and sport etc.

It is in this sense that our approach to children's football constitutes an important informal platform in civil society, where people of different backgrounds can meet and bond while discussing a common purpose: *children - welfare - future*.

CHILD PROTECTION

Ensuring a good environment for children

Preventing violence, Sexual abuses, Bullying etc.

At the Open Fun Football Schools child protection spans from creating a good and safe environment for children where they can thrive, prosper and develop, to the protection from, and prevention of, violence, neglect, sexual abuse, bullying etc. Our objective in safeguarding is to

 Strengthen knowledge, attitudes and behaviour among Cross Cultures voluntary youth coaches conducive to child safeguarding in sports Establish cooperation and referral systems with national protection units to protect children's rights

In essence the approach focuses on a) breaking the taboo around child abuse in sports; b) doing no harm; and c) taking due action in cases of concern by cooperating with national child protection units and having internal procedures in place.




